- Understand the epidemiology of substance abuse in youth and the impact of drug and alcohol use on diagnosis and treatment of co-occurring psychiatric disorders;
- Understand the diagnostic, prognostic, and pharmacologic treatment implications of co-occurring substance use and mood, anxiety, and psychotic disorders in youth;
- Understand the environmental and familial factors that both contribute to and ameliorate co-occurring disorders, and identify skills to engage the family system;
- Utilize identified diagnostic and screening tools in the assessment of children and adolescents with potential co-occurring disorders, with relevant information on cultural sensitivity in the acquisition of substance use and mental health information.
